Top Tip to Avoid Soggy Fish Fingers

After the long period of hot weather we've had and with plenty more forecast, it's time for our annual reminder to the transport refrigeration sector to make sure servicing schedules are up to date.

As the ambient temperature goes up, the brushed fans inside the refrigerated units of supermarket home delivery vans have to work harder to keep things cool and this can have an impact on the life of the fan.

Should a fan breakdown mid-delivery, there is the risk of soggy fish fingers and writing off the entire cargo, so to keep perishables in pristine order door-to-door, get ahead with seasonal maintenance and replace fans early if necessary.

An important point we used to make about replacement fans which still stands today, is always go for quality guaranteed. The efficient operation of the whole refrigerated unit relies on all components being of equal performance.
